CONFERENCE OVERVIEW AND OBJECTIVES

This comprehensive course is designed to help the pediatrician and pediatric sub-specialist to efficiently and effectively address pediatric problems on a daily basis and better serve the pediatric population. Faculty will present information on bellyaches, headaches, fever and rash, pneumonia, chronic cough, oral health, seizures and shock.

Friday, September 11, 2009

At the conclusion of Friday's conference, the attendees should be able to:

- Recognize the biopsychosocial model and functional gastrointestinal disorders; recognize the symptom-based diagnostic criteria for the common functional GI pain disorders; provide effective reassurance to children and parents regarding functional abdominal pain
- Evaluate children with headaches using a history and physical exam specific for headaches and determine when imaging and further testing is indicated; recognize the signs and symptoms of a primary headache disorder from a secondary headache disorder; initiate treatment of childhood migraine and chronic daily headache using an integrated approach with conventional pharmacotherapy as well as complementary practices
- Recognize common causes of fever and rash illness in children
- Recognize the presentation of atypical pneumonia in children; recognize indications for admission in children with pneumonia; develop a treatment plan for atypical pneumonia based on history and chest radiograph

Saturday, September 12, 2009

At the conclusion of Saturday's conference, the attendees should be able to:

- Manage a young infant with fever
- Develop an age based differential for the child with chronic cough; recognize the presenting signs of an anatomic lesion causing cough; recognize the management of psychogenic cough
- Recognize the scope and impact of dental disease in children today; recognize current concepts of the pathophysiology of caries formation and mechanisms of intervention and prevention available to pediatricians; recognize the AAP's Oral Health Initiative, New Recommendations for Pediatricians and learn effective strategies for prevention of dental disease in children
- Recognize the new operational definitions for prolonged seizures and status epilepticus; recognize the pathophysiology of prolonged seizures; recognize the acute treatment protocol for status epilepticus
- Recognize normal hemodynamic relationships in children and pathophysiological alterations in shock states; recognize specific features of hypovolemic, septic and cardiogenic shock; recognize the treatment strategies for pediatric shock based upon traditional and newer therapeutic approaches

- Recognize new issues of infectious diseases and the appropriate evaluation, treatment and/or prevention strategies for dealing with these issues
- Clinically evaluate the child with a tic disorder and be able to distinguish between transient tics, Tourette's and PANDAS; recognize the pathophysiology of PANDAS; recognize various treatment options for tics, Tourette's and PANDAS
