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**Chapter Business**

*Membership* –

Membership statistics for July 2019: 74 members renewed, 41 new members joined, and 39 members let their membership lapse/expire.

Membership statistics for August 2019: 80 members renewed, 19 new members joined, and 19 members let their membership lapse/expire.

Membership statistics for September 2019: 52 members renewed, 275 new members joined, and 23 members let their membership lapse/expire.

As of October 7, 2019, the Louisiana Chapter has a total of 782 members. Of those there are 453 voting members and 782 non-voting members.

\*\* FY 18/19 for the chapter showed a dramatic decrease in membership numbers and revenue. This appears to primarily be related to a change made at the national office in the dues notification process. The Academy quickly recognized that this change had a negative impact both on the Academy and Chapter membership. They have since reverted back to the previous process and have reported that it seems to be correcting itself. We will continue to closely monitor membership numbers.

Dr. Samir El-Dahr has begun requiring all faculty to be a member of the state chapter. This has been evident in the increase in the number of new members.

### *Projects/ Grants*

BCBS Foundation Sleep and School Start Times Grant – Using these funds the Chapter held a one day sleep conference titled, Sleep Well Be Well Conference, on August 15, 2019 in New Orleans. The conference was well received. Three of the presenters from the conference participated in a panel discussion at the 2019 Potpourri on the topic of adolescent sleep. The remaining deliverables for the grant are to produce 2-3 web based trainings on this topic.

Merck Adolescent Vaccines Grant – the Chapter was able to get permission from the Academy to use the remaining funds to conduct a statewide vaccine attitude survey. This survey was conducted and shows promising results. Dr. John Vanchiere and Dr. Joe Bocchini are working with staff and the lobbyist to determine the best way and place to release the information.

HPV QI grant through AAP- The chapter has wrapped up the work for this grant and is in the process of finalizing reports. There were a total of 8 sites that participated with 31 individuals involved. Participants were trained on motivational interviewing techniques, quality improvement basics and process mapping. All clinics showed an improvement in their rates of initiation and a decrease in missed opportunities over the course of the grant. Most of the offices have adopted policies that will allow for them to integrate their new process into the ongoing work building in sustainability.
