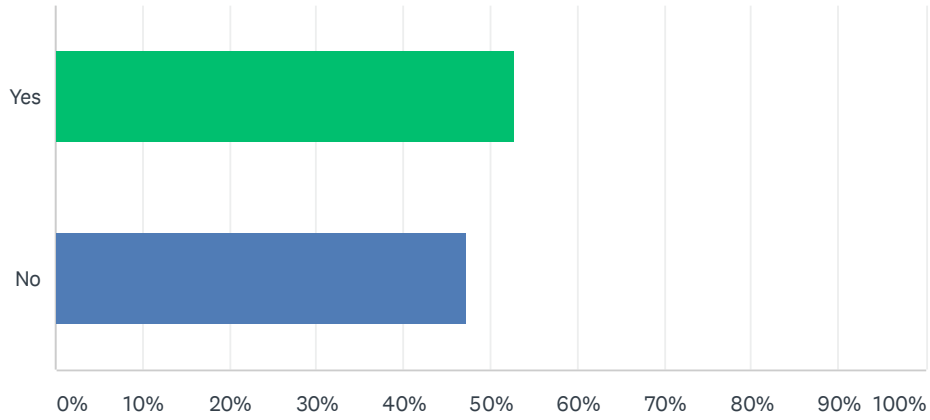

Q10 Are you administering COVID-19 test?

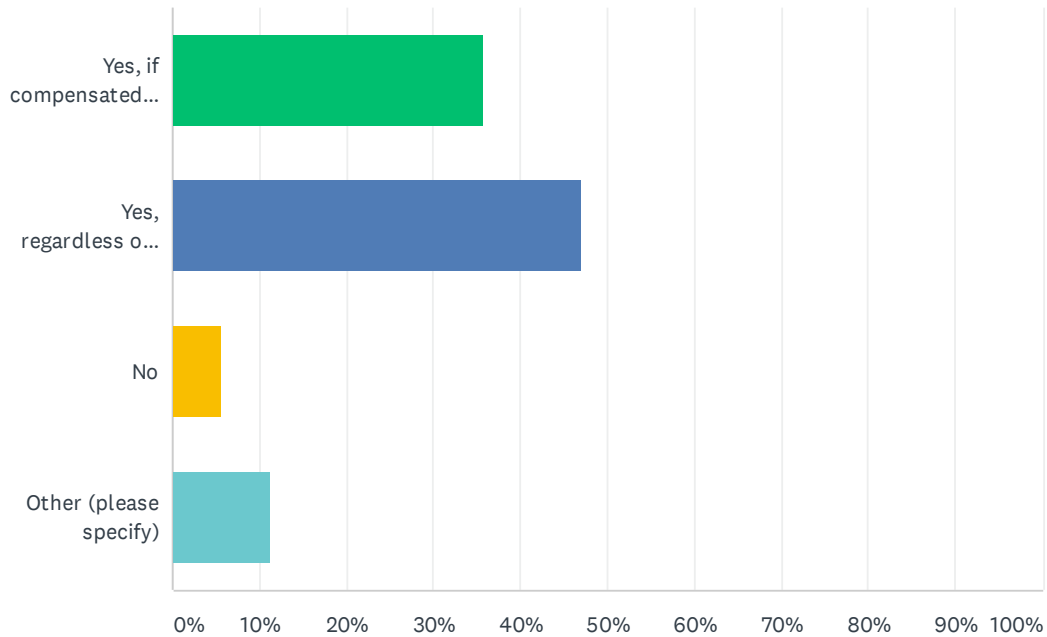

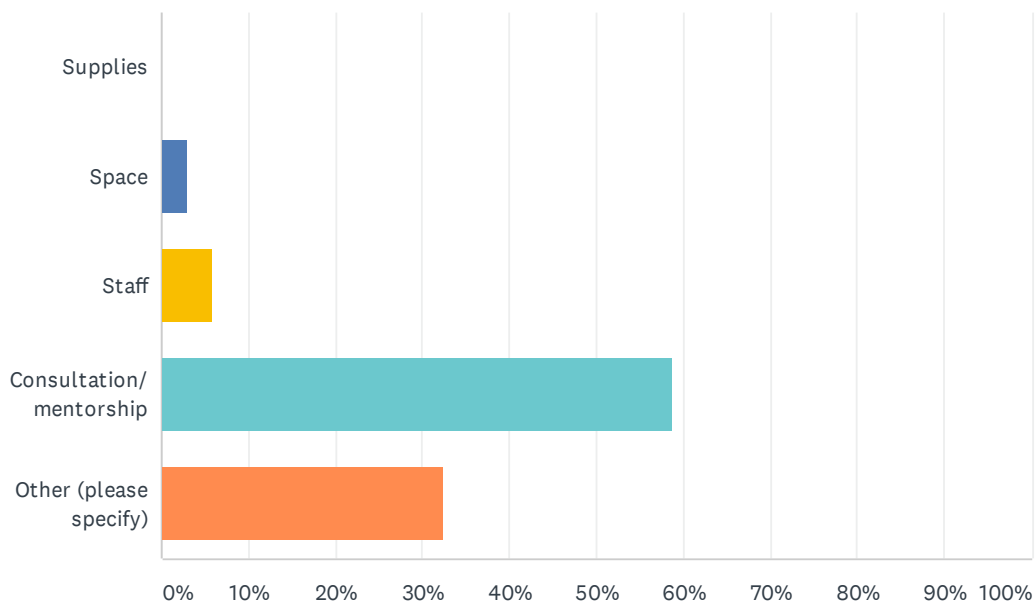
